



The Community EMS scholarship is awarded to a person in the community that is deemed as disadvantaged and unlikely to attend a university program without assistance. The recipient of this scholarship will receive payment of non-matriculated student tuition and fees, state and/or national registration and testing fees, class uniform, and other fees as determined by the scholarship committee. These are limited to cost of course and certification and will not include housing, food, or other non-class related fees. This scholarship will apply to the EMT course to serve as entry into the Emergency Medical Services field.

All eligible applications will be reviewed by the scholarship committee led by the Director of Emergency Programs in the Department of Health, Kinesiology and Recreation. The goal of this scholarship is to assist a person who would not normally be able to take an EMT class to attend and be successful in this class. The hope is that it will lead to a career in EMS which would enable the student to continue their education. The recipient of the Community EMS scholarship will be deemed as disadvantaged by the committee and show potential to be successful in an EMT course. The application process may include interviews with the applicants.
