Financial Assistance:

1. AT Professional Scholarships

The National Athletic Trainers' Association (NATA) Foundation Scholarship program is available for Undergraduate, Master's, and Doctoral students. NATA awards \$2,300 per scholarship and students must apply through the NATA Foundation in order to be considered for the award.

2. Program Scholarships

The Master of Athletic Training program offers the following scholarships for 1st year students:

- The David H. Perrin Athletic Training Program Scholarship is a **\$1,250** award given once.
- The David H. Perrin Athletic Training Program Fee Scholarship is a **\$1,000** award given once.

Students will be considered for the scholarship based on their application for admission into the program and an additional application is not required.

These two scholarships are also available for 2nd year Master of Athletic Training students in the same amount, an application will need to be submitted in order to be considered for the scholarship.

3. Graduate Financial Resources

4. **F.A. Davis Scholarship**

F.A. Davis offers annual scholarships to support students aspiring to work in healthcare. This scholarship is open to students enrolled in a current or upcoming semester, so this is more accessible to students in their 2nd year of the Master of Athletic Training Program.

5. **[Western Regional Graduate Program \(WRGP\)](#)**

The Master of Athletic Training program has a limited number of spots for students to participate in WRGP. This program allows students who are not Utah residents to be charged 110% of the in-state tuition rate, rather than the full non-resident rate.

Students may be eligible for the WRGP if they are residents of one of the following states:

- Alaska
- Arizona
- California
- Colorado
- Guam
- Hawaii
- Idaho
- Montana
- Nevada
- New Mexico
- North Dakota
- Oregon
- South Dakota
- Washington
- Wyoming

Since the MAT program has a limited number of spots, we may not be able to accommodate all students who are eligible for WRGP. Students who are under WRGP cannot count their time in Utah while using this program towards their residency.

6. Residency Status

Students who are not classified as Utah residents and are not selected for a spot in the WRGP will be charged non-resident tuition. Students who are interested in being classified as a Utah resident for tuition purposes should begin the process as soon as possible.

Admissions periodically hosts [Residency Reclassification](#) sessions to assist students in the process of reclassifying as Utah residents. **We encourage students to attend one of these sessions and reach out to the Residency Office prior to the start of the MAT program.**

Prior to starting the program in the summer, students who qualify for reclassification under the one-year rule, may apply for reclassification. This must be completed before you start the program. **If you do not reclassify prior to the start of the program, you will be held to the [Graduate Policy](#) and must meet all of the requirements listed below before you can reclassify.**

The documents listed below are necessary to reclassify under the Graduate Policy:

- U.S. citizenship, granted permanent residency, or granted asylum or refugee status.
- Completion of 40 semester credit hours of graduate-level course work at the University of Utah prior to the requested term of reclassification.
- Evidence that you relinquished domiciliary ties (driver's license, voter registration, and, if applicable, vehicle registration) held in any other state and established them in Utah by the Utah tie deadline.
- Verification of financial independence showing that you are not claimed as a dependent on the federal tax return of any person who is not a resident of Utah.
 - If you are single and 23 years of age or younger, provide a copy of the first two pages of your federal tax return (Form 1040) for the tax year prior to the academic year for which you wish to qualify for resident student status.
 - If you did not file a federal return, provide a copy of your parent(s) federal tax return(s) for the tax year prior to the academic year for which you wish to qualify for resident tuition.
- Proof of physical presence in Utah for at least the 12 continuous months immediately prior to the first day of class for the academic term you wish to be considered a resident student.

Students who reclassify as Utah residents after their 1st year will be charged the resident rate for their 2nd year, reducing the total program cost to \$63,050.20. Students who are under WRGP cannot count their time in Utah while using this program towards their residency.
